Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she intends to plan a wide ranging curriculum and use her observations to plan what children need to learn next. She explains how she will share information about children's progress with their parents and help them to support children's learning further at home.
- The childminder describes how she will promote healthy lifestyles and care practices. She explains how she will support children to learn to manage their personal care needs. The childminder describes how she will offer children a broad range of enjoyable activities in her home and in the local community, to help to promote children's physical development.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows how she recognises the value of working in partnership with parents, to help ensure consistency in children's care and learning. She describes how she will gather useful information from them when children first start at her setting, to support children to settle in swiftly.
- The childminder shares how she will have high expectations regarding children's behaviour. She describes how she will manage their behaviour in a supportive way and build sharing, turn taking and an understanding of others into daily activities.
- The childminder describes how she will identify and eliminate potential risks to children, to promote their welfare and ensure they can play safely. Through discussion, she demonstrates a clear understanding of how to safeguard children and how to seek advice and support should she have a concern.
- The childminder explains how she will evaluate her practice to identify ways she can improve children's experiences. She describes how she will continue to improve her skills and knowledge further.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the childminder.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her childcare practices throughout the inspection to establish her understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's home intended for childminding purposes. She checked the suitability of toys and resources available and discussed with the childminder how she monitors children's learning and development.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation, including the childminder's public liability insurance and training certificates and first-aid certificate.
- The inspector verified evidence of suitability for the childminder and the adults working and living on the premises.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
