Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains what skills she intends children to learn in readiness for school. She explains how she will plan a curriculum to build on what they know and can do. She explains how she will make effective links with children's parents to establish their starting points and how she will build a curriculum around children's individual needs. The childminder discusses how she plans to carry out ongoing assessments of children and the importance of sharing information with parents.
- The childminder understands how to support children to develop an active and healthy lifestyle. She plans to take children out into the local community and take part in activities with other children to support their self-confidence and social skills.
- The childminder has a clear approach to how she will manage children's behaviour. She confidently describes how she will be consistent in the messages she gives children, so they can fully understand her expectations. She plans to teach children to respect each other and be aware of their own emotional well-being and the well-being of others.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing partnerships with parents and other professionals. She describes how she would share information with parents about the progress their children make.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. She knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about children's welfare. The childminder understands the actions to take if there are any allegations made against her or members of her household.
- The childminder demonstrates her commitment to her professional development since her last inspection. She discusses how she has attended training to keep her knowledge current and up to date. The childminder understands how to make use of external agencies to further support children with their learning and development needs.
- The childminder describes how she will value all children's backgrounds. She explains her plans to recognise important festivals and events and help children to understand different communities and cultures.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector verified evidence of suitability for the childminder and the adults working and living on the premises.
- The childminder showed the inspector the premises. She discussed how she would ensure they are safe and suitable and changes she would make if children were attending.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
