Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to protect children's welfare. She follows safeguarding procedures and has updated her knowledge of child protection through training. A range of policies to support the childminder's practice are in place and available for parents.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the learning and development requirements and has procedures to observe and assess children's learning. A good range of toys and resources is available which supports the seven areas of learning.
- The childminder gathers appropriate information about children to meet their individual needs. She has a secure understanding of how to promote children's good health and well-being.
- Suitable procedures are in place to ensure relevant information is shared between parents and the childminder, in order to meet children's needs and build positive relationships. This includes information regarding children's progress in a daily diary.
- The childminder has a positive attitude to continually developing and improving the provision, and attending training to develop her skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked around the childminder's home and at the resources available for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide a range of activities and experiences for children to support their learning.
- The inspector talked with the childminder about how she keeps children safe and protects them from potential harm.
- The inspector reviewed the childminder's policies and documentation, including those for assessing children's development, and for safeguarding.

The childminder registered in 2003. She lives in the Turnpike Lane area of the London Borough of Haringey. The childminder works each weekday throughout most of the year. At the time of inspection, the childminder had no children on roll.
