Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a paediatric first-aid certificate as required to meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She does though, hold a current first-aid certificate that covers elements of paediatric emergency care. This meets the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder knows how to plan resources and activities to help promote children's learning. She recognises the importance of sharing information with parents to help them support their children's learning at home to promote consistent progress.
- The childminder plans to teach children about rules and boundaries to help them learn to manage their own behaviour.
- The childminder intends to encourage children to eat healthily, and provide opportunities for fresh air and exercise to help them learn about healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of safeguarding procedures. She knows the process to follow if she has concerns about the welfare of children and families.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice to identify strengths and weaknesses and promote positive outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
