Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of the procedures to follow if there are concerns about a child's safety or welfare. Since her last inspection, she has completed training to improve her knowledge and understanding of child protection and safeguarding procedures. The childminder has written a safeguarding policy with all the relevant contact details.
- The childminder intends to work with parents to ensure she finds out about their child's needs and development. She will share information with the parents about their child's developmental progress, and daily care. The childminder will work with other professionals, to implement action plans to help with the child's development.
- The childminder has completed training to improve her understanding of the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. She intends to identify what children can do when they first come to her, and identify areas she will work on to support their development. The childminder will use the local facilities to access resources and activities, to support children's learning. This includes both indoor and outdoor activities.
- The childminder has ensured that the premises are safe and suitable. She will complete a risk assessment before children arrive, ensuring that the premises and equipment they use are safe and suitable for the age of the child attending. The premises are secure and the childminder will ensure that children cannot leave the setting without her.
- The childminder explained she will adapt the provision for children with any additional needs, including medical or educational needs. The childminder will provide opportunities for children to learn about a range of cultures, to enable them to find out about a variety of festivals throughout the year.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. She intends to support children's personal, social and emotional development through age appropriate activities and resources. The childminder intends to enable children to learn about their emotions and how to express themselves.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
