Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to work with other settings children attend to help ensure continuity and progression to children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands how to provide a range of opportunities to support children's learning and to help them learn new knowledge and skills. For example, she knows how to help children learn about their own identity and other cultures and traditions around them.
- The childminder is knowledgeable about safeguarding practice and the reporting procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder undertakes checks on her home, toys and outings to help keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how she can use her first-aid knowledge to attend to the needs of each child. For example, she is aware of food allergies and knows how to meet children's dietary requirements carefully.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents. For example, she keeps parents regularly informed about their children's progress and well-being, and involves them in planning the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder attends courses to widen her skills in order to benefit children's learning. She seeks the views of parents and outside professionals to further improve her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used for childminding with the childminder.
- The inspector checked the childminder's policies and procedures, including safeguarding requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge and skills relating to the early years foundation stage.
