Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good awareness of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
- There is a good range of resources and activities that the childminder uses to help her promote children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of monitoring children's progress. She shares this with parents and other professionals, as necessary, when she plans for the next steps in children's learning.
- To promote children's healthy lifestyles, the childminder is aware of the need to provide nutritious foods and exercise in the fresh air.
- The childminder is familiar with her local safeguarding and child protection procedures. She knows whom to contact if she has concerns about a child's welfare to help keep them safe.
- Children learn about what behaviours are acceptable as the childminder knows to teach them about boundaries.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her practice in order to improve outcomes for children. She keeps up to date with early years developments by talking to other childminders and by doing research.
- The childminder completes regular risk assessments of her home and carries out evacuation practises to keep children safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her safeguarding knowledge.
- The inspector looked at the garden and rooms available for children.
