The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a sound knowledge and understanding of how to deliver the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Since her last inspection the childminder has worked closely with other providers to enhance the learning outcomes for children.
- All children have a learning journal, this clearly shows how the childminder uses observations of children's play to plan a challenging learning environment. This demonstrates that children are making good progress in their learning.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being. She demonstrates through discussion the importance of providing children with a healthy diet and developing their understanding of good hygiene practices. She understands how to manage children's behaviour by being a positive role model.
- The childminder has given careful consideration to how to organise space within her home. Therefore, children are able to access a suitable range of resources.
- The childminder is aware of the need to work in partnership with parents and others who are involved in the care and learning of the children. This helps to ensure that children receive relevant support and continuity in their learning and development.
- The childminder understands her role and responsibility with regard to safeguarding children, this means that they are protected. She also has a relevant range of policies, including safeguarding and complaints procedures, which are shared with parents.
- The childminder effectively addressed actions and recommendations from her previous inspection, for example, she has implemented the progress check for children between the ages of two and three years, to enable her to identify children's development needs and share this information with parents.
- The childminder explains that the children have daily opportunities to explore the local community, they regularly visit local parks, play areas and beaches. This also helps to develop them physically and keeps them active.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she implements the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder uses when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and qualifications of the childminder.

Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 2004 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her husband and child aged 14 years in a house in Saltburn. The whole of the ground floor and first floor bathroom are used for childminding. The childminder attends a toddler group and activities at the local children's centre. She visits the shops, nature reserve, beach and parks on a regular basis. She collects children from the local schools and pre-schools. There are currently 12 children on roll, of which five are in the early years age group and attend for a variety of sessions. The childminder operates all year round, from 7.30am to 6.30pm, every week day except bank holidays and family holidays. There were no children present at the time of the inspection.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
