Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of what to do if she is concerned about children's safety or welfare. She has effective systems in place to help assure children's safety and takes appropriate action if children's welfare is compromised.
- The childminder intends to gather initial and ongoing information from parents in order to plan activities based on what children know and can do. She explains how she will tailor her service to meet children's needs, share information with parents about children's care and learning, and involve them if children do not progress as expected.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and local schools to provide continuity of children's care and learning. She uses her links with other practitioners to help evaluate her service and make improvements.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's health. She plans to discuss healthy eating with children, reinforce good hygiene habits and give children opportunities to exercise and play in fresh air.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the resources and areas of the childminder's home that children use.
- The inspector reviewed documents, including policies and procedures, and those used to record information relating to children's learning, safety and health.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and checked evidence of the suitability of household members.
