Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder is not up to date with the current guidance for safeguarding children, in line with the Local Safeguarding Children Board. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements. In addition, she does not have a policy that covers the use of mobile phones and cameras. However, she knows the signs that would cause her concern for a child's welfare and how to report these.
- The childminder does not have a written statement of procedures for safeguarding. This is a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder does not have a paediatric first aid certificate. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder has not ensured that the premises are safe and secure for the children in her care. In particular, loose wires and electrical equipment are not securely stored.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She is able to explain how she would provide appropriate challenge to children to enable them to make progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health, for example, with daily opportunities for fresh air and physical exercise.
- The childminder understands how to help children to develop positive values to enable them to behave well, and tolerate and respect others.
- The childminder is keen to improve her practice and undertake the necessary training to ensure that she fully meets all the requirements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
