

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage (EYFS), which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 31 March 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to medicines, training and skills and safeguarding policies and procedures. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the EYFS to notify Ofsted of a significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the early years provider to look after children.

On 3 June 2026, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. Following an incident, the provider found a breach in the EYFS requirements as staff did not follow their policies and procedures regarding the administering of medicines. The provider has taken satisfactory action by reviewing their policies and procedures and supporting staff with further training to ensure sound knowledge and understanding of their roles and responsibilities to ensure the safety of children. We also found that although the provider notified us on 20 October 2025 of changes to the premises which may affect the space available to children, this notification was not received within 14 days, which is a requirement of their registration. However, there was no impact to children, as the provider had effectively carried out a risk assessment. The provider is now aware that any notification to Ofsted must be made as soon as is reasonably practical to do so, however no later than 14 days.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
