Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her safeguarding responsibility to keep children safe from harm. She is familiar with the procedures to follow to report any concerns she may have about children in her care.
- The childminder has an appropriate understanding of how to promote children's development. She knows how to plan activities and support children to make progress in their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other professionals, to support children's care and progress. She plans to invite parents to provide regular feedback on the service they receive.
- The childminder maintains her professional development as part of self-evaluation. For example, she attends specific training, and has taken positive action to address the previous recommendation to further enhance children's awareness of diversity.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to develop skills for their future learning, such as independence, good behaviour and good health.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge and understanding of safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to observe, plan and assess children's learning.
- The inspector observed a range of equipment, resources and areas of the home to which children have access.
- The inspector discussed the professional development of the childminder.
- The inspector looked at relevant documents used in the management of the setting, and for sharing with parents.

The childminder registered in 2004. She lives Woodford Green, in the London Borough of Redbridge. The childminder offers care for children Monday to Friday, from 7.45am to 9am and 3.30pm to 6pm.
