

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundationstage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 February 2025, the provider notified us about injuries to a child and concerns about a child's welfare (safeguarding policies and procedures.) The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 10 March 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. However, the provider had taken prompt and diligent action to investigate the matter, under the guidance of other agencies. They ensured safeguarding systems in place in the setting were understood and being followed by other staff. They revisited training and undertook a full audit of documentation relevant to the concerns.

On 17 March 2025, the provider notified us about an allegation expressed against a member of staff (concerns about children's safety and welfare.) The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any serious harm or abuse.

On 3 April 2025, the provider notified us about a historic concern about children's nappy changing (safety and suitability of premises, environment and equipment.) The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 16 April 2025, the provider notified us about a child accessing food which did not meet their dietary requirements and health needs (health.) The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 22 April 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. However, the provider took prompt action by following individual health care plans and providing medical assistance. The provider then revisited their policies and procedures and put in place systems to prevent such breaches of requirements occurring in the future. They ensured staff were aware of the procedures to follow to ensure

all children's individual health needs were met.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
