Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a sound understanding of her duty to safeguard children. She is able to recognise signs that may indicate a child is at risk of harm and knows the correct procedures for reporting concerns to the appropriate agencies.
- The childminder discusses she is aware that she will conduct thorough checks and risk assessments of the environment and resources, to ensure that any potential hazards are identified and promptly addressed, helping to keep children safe.
- The childminder shows a clear understanding of how to plan and deliver a broad range of activities that support children's learning and development, enabling them to make progress across all areas of the curriculum.
- The childminder recognises the value of working closely with parents and external professionals to meet each child's individual needs. She has a sound understanding of how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).
- The childminder explains the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles and plans to encourage children to eat well, stay physically active, and enjoy outdoor play.
- The childminder has high expectations for behaviour and can clearly explain how she will support children to build positive relationships. She intends to embed sharing, turn-taking, and respect for others into daily routines.
- The childminder describes how she will build strong attachments with children, supporting their emotional well-being and developing their independence.
- The childminder understands the importance of self-evaluation and regularly reflects on her practice in collaboration with parents and professionals to improve the quality of care and learning she provides.
- The childminder remains committed to ongoing professional development. She keeps her knowledge current by engaging with early years advisers and undertaking independent online research to refresh and enhance her skills.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
