

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 19 February 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to Suitable people. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of matters related to safeguarding.

On 23 March 2026, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Actions needed by 20 April 2026:

- ensure that leaders have made sure that all persons working with children are suitable
- improve the arrangements for the supervision of staff, to ensure that there is an effective culture of mutual support, teamwork, and continuous improvement, which encourages the confidential discussion of sensitive issues.

On 23 April 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions. We found the provider has reviewed and improved support for staff to ensure their wellbeing and training needs are met. This includes strengthening their procedures to ensure that appropriate support is identified and implemented. Additionally, they have refreshed staff's understanding of keeping the provider informed of any changes to suitability. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
