Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is familiar with safeguarding procedures and knows how to report any concerns regarding a child's welfare. She understands the importance of minimising risk and providing a safe environment for children in her home.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the learning and development requirements. She has a good range of toys and resources and can demonstrate how she will provide activities for children of different ages across all areas of learning.
- The childminder explains the importance of teaching children about healthy lifestyles. She provides healthy snacks and meals and promotes fresh air and exercise daily to support children's physical development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She intends to share starting points and ongoing development to help promote continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of being a good role model and supporting children's good behaviour. She describes the need to set clear boundaries, give regular praise and encouragement and reinforce good manners.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and evaluates her provision to make ongoing improvements. She has completed her mandatory training and has identified areas for ongoing professional development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked areas of the home used for childminding and the suitability of adults living in the home.
- The inspector assessed the childminder's understanding of safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her role and responsibilities in meeting the early years foundation stage requirements, including undertaking observations, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she uses self-evaluation to make improvements to her practice.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder meeting the welfare requirements, including her registration, insurance and paediatric first-aid qualification.
