Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to use information gained from observations and assessments to plan for children's individual needs to help them make progress in readiness for school.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and meets all Childcare Register requirements.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrated her knowledge of how to help children learn to manage their own behaviour, including turn taking and sharing resources.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in the children's care to provide a consistent approach. She understands the need to provide parents with regular feedback about children's progress to support and encourage their learning at home.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrated her understanding of the importance of building strong relationships with children to support their emotional well-being and confidence.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles for children by offering nutritional foods and regular opportunities for exercise to support their physical development and health.
- The childminder demonstrates her knowledge of the possible signs and symptoms that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare. She knows the procedures to follow should she have any safeguarding concerns.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her role and responsibilities in meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector sampled relevant documentation, including the childminder's suitability checks, policies and procedures and training certificates.
