Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder ensures that her knowledge on safeguarding matters and procedures is up to date. Daily risk assessments help the childminder to take appropriate action to minimise potential risks to children.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour and the need to teach them how to be kind, caring and respectful to others.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with healthy choices. She demonstrates a good awareness of how to provide healthy snacks, meals and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands how to promote the learning and development of all children. She is aware of how to use observations and assessments to monitor children's progress and to plan for their next steps in learning. A suitable range of toys and resources was observed during the inspection.
- The childminder understands the role of self-evaluation to support the continuous improvement of her provision and she intends to seek the views of parents.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
