

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 12 February 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to children's safeguarding and welfare. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 20 February 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to safeguarding policies and procedures and changes that must be notified to Ofsted. Although the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event, this was not in the required timescales of 14 days.

On 5 March 2026, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting the requirements relating to information and record keeping and suitable people. These matters relate to the same requirements as the provider's notifications.

On 10 March 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider and staff had reflected and improved their understanding of changes that must be notified to Ofsted and of the required timescales expected. They had refreshed and reviewed their safeguarding policies and procedures. The provider has also put in place procedures to ensure this knowledge is consistently maintained by all adults. In addition, the provider took prompt action to reflect, reassess and improve their knowledge and understanding of data protection requirements and confidentiality agreements for all adults who live and work at the setting.

On 16 March 2026, we received further concerns about children's safeguarding and welfare. On 16 March 2026 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. The focus of the call was to check that the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare requirements. We found the provider was meeting the requirements for children's safeguarding and welfare.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
