Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She is clear about child protection matters, current legislation and the procedures to follow to help safeguard children.
- The childminder knows how to support children's learning and has suitable systems to help her monitor and assess their development. She knows how to observe children during their play, and to plan activities that support the next steps in their learning. She is aware of how to support them to gain the skills they need for their future learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting good behaviour, kindness and respect for others to help support children's personal development and their welfare.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents. She knows to share information about children's development and to encourage two-way communication about children's welfare and learning.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her practice and develop her skills. She researches good practice and accesses relevant further training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's qualifications and suitability.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents that the childminder uses.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the home available for childminding and discussed with the childminder how she plans to use the space.
- The inspector asked the childminder to discuss how she plans to meet the needs of children.
