Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has suitable safeguarding knowledge. She is able to discuss her clear understanding of child protection procedures. She understands when to make a referral if she is concerned about a child.
- The childminder understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She has a selection of suitable policies and procedures in place. She maintains thorough and regular risk assessments of her home in order to promote children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of how children learn and develop. She has a range of suitably appropriate toys and resources. She explains how she plans activities based on children's interests and requirements.
- The childminder is committed to developing her provision. She demonstrates a positive attitude to her own continued professional development.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of how to promote healthy lifestyles with children. She discusses how she plans opportunities for children to regularly play outdoors in order to promote their physical development.
- The childminder discusses how she supports children's emotional well-being. She understands how to manage children's behaviour positively.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents. She discusses the importance of providing consistent support for children's learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the house used for childminding. She viewed the resources and equipment available for children to use.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder to discuss and review a range of documents, including policies, risk assessments and children's records.
- The inspector reviewed evidence of the childminder's suitability and her qualifications, including paediatric first aid.
