Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not taken effective action to address concerns raised at her last inspection. Significant weaknesses remain and the childminder does not demonstrate sufficient capacity to improve her service.
- The childminder does not have sufficient understanding of the ways in which children learn. She has a limited knowledge of the type of activities to offer to engage children's interest and support their learning.
- The childminder lacks a secure awareness of how to work in partnership with parents to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder does not understand how to observe and assess children's progress to plan for their individual learning. She does not have a clear knowledge of her responsibility to complete a progress check for two-year-old children and to provide a written summary for their parents.
- The childminder does not understand issues relating to equality and diversity to ensure that she is able to respect children as individuals, regardless of their gender. She does not recognise the importance of supporting children to learn about, and respect, people who have backgrounds, cultures and beliefs that are different from their own.
- The childminder has appropriate knowledge of child protection procedures and is aware of the action to take should she be concerned about a child's welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

■ develop sufficient understanding of issues relating to equality of opportunity and anti-discriminatory practice to be able to support children to form positive social skills and to understand and respect the similarities and differences between themselves and others.	31/01/2018

The childminder registered in 2005. She lives in Plaistow in the London Borough of Newham. The childminder operates Monday to Friday from 7.30am to 6.30pm, throughout most of the year.
