Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has considered how she will review the service she provides to drive forward improvements. She has developed strategies to enable her to gain the views of parents and include this information in her self-evaluation.
- The childminder understands her duty to keep children safe and to notify Ofsted of anything which may affect her suitability. She knows how to recognise indicators that a child may be at risk of harm and how to refer any concerns about a child's welfare. The childminder has a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows how to monitor and assess children's learning. The childminder can plan activities to build on what children know and can do.
- The childminder provides a suitable environment for children's care. She understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's care, to meet their needs effectively.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the premises, including the outdoor area, and the resources that will be used for childminding.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver educational programmes for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to evaluate her provision.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other adults in the household.
