Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable range of toys to support children's progress across all areas of learning. She has attended courses relating to observing children during play. This enables her to plan activities that help them develop and learn.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to keep children safe. She has completed training in child protection. This equips her with the correct procedures to follow if she has a concern about a child's welfare. The childminder is aware that she must share her written policies with parents when she cares for children who are older than those in the early years age range.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's health. She is able to guide children to practise personal hygiene, provides them with suitable meals and ensures they have sufficient exercise. The childminder holds a paediatric first-aid certificate and has procedures to follow in the event of an emergency. All documentation for efficient recording of children's welfare is in place.
- The childminder understands the importance of sharing information with parents. The childminder plans to provide parents with daily information that will help them to continue their children's learning at home.
- The childminder keeps her knowledge up to date by attending essential training and she maintains current public liability insurance.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector saw areas the childminder will use for children's play inside and looked at the childminder's garden.
- The inspector looked at a range of policies and documents that support children's welfare and safety.
- The inspector had discussions with the childminder about her childminding activities, including how she safeguards children and promotes their learning and development.
