Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has secure knowledge and understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. She has met the recommendation following the last inspection, recently gained a relevant qualification and regularly attends training to support her professional development to improve her provision.
- The childminder has appropriate procedures for completing and using risk assessment to keep children safe within the home and on outings. She attends regular child protection training and has clear and appropriate procedures in place for acting on concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder is clear about her responsibility to help prepare children for moving on to nursery or school and how knows how to do this.
- The childminder has suitable processes in place for assessing, tracking and planning for children's progress in partnership with parents and other agencies involved with children. She understands how to provide a good range of activities to support the learning and development of children of varying ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- The childminder has good ideas for encouraging children to adopt healthy and active lifestyle habits. She knows the importance of providing children with nutritionally well-balanced snacks and meals and ensure children have daily outdoor experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's learning and development, and meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at the records and documentation the childminder has for use when caring for children, including those related to safeguarding and the childminder's suitability to work with children.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the premises and clarified that the childminder had suitable furniture, toys and equipment.
