Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of child development and has established procedures to observe and assess children's progress. She plans to tailor play activities to each child's individual interests and needs.
- The childminder intends to deliver a broad curriculum, combining diverse indoor activities with outings in the local community to keep children engaged and actively learning throughout the day.
- The childminder values politeness and plans to model respectful and courteous behaviour, supporting children's emotional wellbeing. Her clear vision is to create a welcoming, home-like environment where children feel safe and valued. She also emphasises setting clear behaviour expectations and uses regular praise to boost children's confidence and self-esteem.
- To promote children's health and wellbeing, the childminder plans to offer a variety of nutritious, home-cooked meals and encourages healthy eating habits from an early age. She also prioritises physical activity and outdoor play, ensuring children have plenty of fresh air and exercise.
- Committed to ongoing professional development, the childminder regularly updates her knowledge through training and reflects on her practice. She maintains a positive attitude towards continuous improvement to better support the children in her care.
- Safety is a top priority in the setting. The childminder has implemented effective measures to reduce risks at home and is fully aware of her safeguarding duties. She understands the signs of abuse and knows the appropriate contacts to report any concerns about a child's welfare.
- Recognising the importance of working closely with parents, the childminder plans ongoing communication to provide consistent and complementary care for the children. She also understands the value of collaborating with other settings and schools to ensure smooth transitions and continuity in children's learning and development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
