Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to support children's learning and development. She knows how to observe, plan and assess children's achievements to ensure they make progress, and prepare for their eventual move to school.
- The childminder knows how to reflect on her practice and plan for improvement. She recognises the importance of discussing ideas with her assistant, and attending training to support consistent teaching standards.
- The childminder is familiar with how to identify and report any concerns she has about children's safety and welfare. She knows how to keep her knowledge of child protection up to date to ensure she can report any concerns promptly.
- The childminder has a wide variety of toys and resources to appeal to a variety of ages and stages of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working together with parents, to support children's all round needs.
- The childminder recognises different ways to keep children safe and healthy, for example, through completing risk assessments and good handwashing practices.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she organises spaces and activities to support children's development.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder's assistant about her understanding of child protection.
- The inspector viewed resources available and looked at parts of the childminder's home intended for use when working.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including policies and suitability checks.
