## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has updated her safeguarding knowledge and is able to explain her safeguarding policy. The childminder is aware of possible risks to children's welfare, including exposure to extreme views, domestic abuse and unsafe technology. The childminder understands the procedures to follow if she suspects a child is at risk of abuse or harm. She knows how to correctly respond if an allegation is made against her or a member of her household.
- The childminder describes the activities that she would provide for children of differing ages and abilities. She explains how she would help children to engage in activities that they enjoy, based on their interests and individual needs. The childminder explains her arrangements to assess children's learning and share information with parents about the progress that children make.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents. She explains how she will gather initial and ongoing information about children's achievements and experiences at home. She describes how she will work with parents if children do not progress as expected. The childminder knows where to seek support and advice if gaps in children's learning persist.
- The childminder shares how she intends to promote children's health and well-being. She explains how she would use resources in her community to support children's learning. For example, she would visit local groups and parks to help children socialise in wider groups and develop their physical skills. The childminder describes how she would help children to understand her expectations and celebrate their backgrounds and culture.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The childminder and inspector discussed educational programmes and safeguarding.
