The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is able to explain how to assess and minimise risks in the home environment and has public liability insurance. She has a sound understanding of child protection issues in order to safeguard children and assure their well-being. She is able to discuss the procedure to follow should she have any safeguarding concerns about a child in her care.
- The childminder holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate and has the knowledge and skills to meet children's needs in the event of a minor accident or emergency. She understands the importance of sharing this information with parents and discussing any existing injuries that children have, to further promote their well-being.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She understands how to use observation and assessment to evaluate children's progress and to provide optimal challenge in the activities she offers, in order to target specific areas of development.
- The environment is well organised and provides a wide range of resources and activities, which are appropriate for children's ages and stages in development. She also understands the importance of supporting children to become independent and encouraging them to make decisions and choices.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles, a healthy diet, exercise and the importance of children being able to access fresh air on a daily basis.
- The childminder understands the need for developing good relationships with parents, to ensure there is a two-way flow of information which provides children with continuity and consistency of care. She works closely with parents and local schools to support children when the time comes for them to join the Reception class.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the childminder's home, including the kitchen, garden and play areas.
The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other adults
- in the household, the childminder's qualifications and discussed the self-evaluation process for improving practice.
- The inspector looked at documentation and a selection of policies and procedures that the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver educational programmes for children.

Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 2006 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her husband and three children aged six, four and one years, in a house in Crossroads, Keighley. The purpose-built playroom, kitchen and downstairs toilet are used for childminding. There is an enclosed garden available for outside play. The childminder accesses local parks and play areas. She collects children from the local schools. The childminder operates from 7.30am to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, except for Christmas and during family holidays. There are currently eight children on roll, none of whom are in the early years age range.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
