Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of safeguarding children procedures. This enables her to protect children from harm and abuse.
- The childminder is able to demonstrate a clear understanding of the learning and development requirements. This means that she is able to fully support children's learning and plan for their next steps progress.
- The childminder adopts a thoughtful approach to working in partnership with parents, carers and other childcare professionals. Consequently, she is able to provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder is able to clearly describe how she manages risks around the home and on outings. This helps her to keep children safe.
- The childminder clearly describes how to promote children's good health and implement appropriate hygiene procedures, this encourages children to adopt healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder holds an appropriate first-aid qualification and maintains required records, such as attendance registers, to ensure that children's safe care and well-being is fully supported.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide a range of learning activities for children and how she will observe, assess and plan for their continuing progress.
- The inspector looked at a sample of policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and training of the childminder.
- The inspector observed the areas of the childminder's home where childcare is to be provided.
