Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates that she has a good understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan activities for individual children that will follow their interest, and provide suitable challenges to help them to make good progress in their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting all children to develop independence skills and an enjoyment of learning. This prepares children for their move to school and other early years provisions.
- The childminder provides suitable resources that meet the needs of children at different stages of development.
- The childminder clearly describes how to promote children's good health and implement appropriate hygiene procedures, in order to encourage children to adopt healthy lifestyles.
- The premises are safe and secure as risk assessments are undertaken to keep children safe from harm. The childminder holds a suitable first-aid qualification, so she is able to respond appropriately in the event of an accident.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable understanding of safeguarding procedures and knows how to report concerns where necessary. She fully understands her responsibility to protect children's welfare. A range of policies that underpin the childminder's practice are available to share with parents.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to raising standards for children. She regularly attends training to develop her professional knowledge. The views of parents and children are taken into account when considering ways to improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed how the childminder intends to deliver the educational programmes for children, and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's policies and procedures that the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of household members.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the way she evaluates her provision, and plans further improvements.
