Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to support children's learning and development, for example, by providing a range of activities and resources according to their age and abilities.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and sharing regular information with them about their child's progress and development.
- The childminder knows how to keep children safe. She knows what to do if she has any safeguarding concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of continual improvement and developing her skills. For example, she keeps up to date with new legislation.
- The childminder understands the importance of managing children's behaviour in a positive way. She knows to provide clear instruction to help children recognise how to behave well.
- The childminder is aware of sharing information with other early years settings children may attend, to work together to meet children's learning and care needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector toured the areas of the home available for childminding.
- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she will keep children safe and the procedures she would follow if she was concerned about a child.
- The inspector sampled the childminder's paperwork.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the persons living at the childminder's home.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will work in partnership with parents and other early years settings.

The childminder is available all year round on weekdays from 7am to 6pm, excluding bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder has a level 3 early years qualification.
