Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents and establishing close links, gathering information about each child. She talks about keeping parents fully informed about their children's ongoing care, learning and development.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear knowledge and understanding of her responsibilities to safeguard children. She is aware of the possible signs a child might be at risk of harm. She knows what procedures to follow to protect a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of carrying out risk assessments to ensure the premises are safe and suitable.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping herself up to date in order to meet the requirements. She talks with other providers to share good practice.
- The childminder knows how children learn and develop. She plans to assess and track their progress. She has a range of suitable toys and resources in place.
- The childminder demonstrates how she will promote children's good behaviour. She understands how to create an inclusive setting.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by the children and discussed the equipment and resources available.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed the documentation intended for use when caring for children.
- The childminder discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
