Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has undertaken training since her last inspection. She has improved in all areas and the welfare requirements that were set at her last inspection have been met.
- The childminder demonstrates her understanding of the changes to the curriculum and how she will implement this with children in her care. She understands how to assess children's stages of learning and development. She is now able to demonstrate she has the skills to meet the individual needs of the children.
- The childminder's approach to behaviour management has improved. She states how she will use positive reinforcement with the children and praise. She states how she will work with parents to find out what they are doing at home, so they can be consistent in their approach to behaviour management.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of safeguarding and child protection. She now understands reporting procedures and signs and symptoms to be alert to. She is able to keep children safe.
- The childminder understands how to support children's personal development. She states she will support their self-help skills, such as toileting, handwashing and getting dressed and undressed.
- The childminder explains how, when children first start with her, she gathers key information from the parents, such as dietary requirements, key likes and dislikes and children's health.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
