Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a strong understanding of child development. She explains how she will support children to reach the next stage in their development. The childminder intends to provide a curriculum that is child led, with children's interests at the forefront of her setting. She explains how she will gain children's starting points in development from parents before children start. The childminder plans to keep a detailed learning journal for each child to monitor their progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents. She discusses how she intends to share information with them and build a consistent, strong relationship. For example, the childminder explains she will provide verbal feedback and photos. She discusses the importance of this to ensure that any potential concerns are dealt with promptly.
- The childminder explains how she will support children's independence. She describes how she intends to support children to do things for themselves from an early age. For example, the childminder discusses how she will support children with washing their hands after using the toilet.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding. She is able to describe the possible signs and symptoms of abuse. The childminder knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about children's welfare. She attends regular training to keep her knowledge up to date.
- The childminder understands the importance of inclusivity. She has a range of fun and interesting resources to support children in the different areas of learning. The childminder explains how she intends to support children to develop an understanding of different cultures and religions.
- The childminder explains how she keeps her knowledge up to date. She attends regular mandatory training in first aid and safeguarding. The childminder discusses how she supports her professional development, through online seminars and reading up-to-date research within the early years.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's positive behaviour. She understands that providing a warm and inclusive environment will promote positive behaviour and interactions.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
