Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a variety of equipment available for children. She shared her intentions to incorporate different outings into the routine. She spoke about the importance of children having a variety of opportunities and experiences available for them to explore.
- The childminder discussed how she intends to focus her curriculum on preparing children for their further education. She demonstrates a firm knowledge of the seven areas of development. The childminder shared how she aims to implement learning opportunities. She expressed a good knowledge of how she intends to adapt activities and experiences to meet the needs of all children.
- The childminder expressed how she forms an understanding of each child's unique starting points. She explained how she will use this information to inform her practice. The childminder will observe children and plan activities to help them to develop their skills.
- The childminder spoke passionately about building positive relationships with children and families. She expressed the importance of children feeling safe and happy and the benefits this has on their emotional well-being.
- The childminder spoke about the importance of supporting children to manage their feelings and behaviour. She expressed how she intends to offer explanations to children. The childminder shared how she believes this will support children to understand expectations.
- The childminder discussed the importance of recognising and learning about different cultures. She spoke about celebrating with children and families. She explained how she will learn recipes from children's home lives. She believes that this develops her knowledge and ensures that children and parents feel included and welcomed within the setting.
- The childminder spoke about how she aims to promote healthy practices. She spoke about children exploring different healthy foods and discussed exercise and handwashing routines. She understands how this will support children to learn about healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder shared how she reflects on practice. She spoke about how she will reflect on activities and develop these to support children. The childminder spoke about the positive aspects of the setting. She also explained how she wants to explore more training opportunities to help to enhance her practice.
- The childminder has a good knowledge and understanding of how she intends to keep the setting safe for children. She is aware of the signs and symptoms that may indicate that a child is at risk of harm or neglect. The childminder knows the actions that she would take if she had any concerns about a child's welfare.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
