Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands safeguarding issues, and she knows the procedures to follow if she has concerns about children's safety or welfare.
- The childminder has developed appropriate systems to observe and assess children's learning. She knows how to plan activities that are interesting, challenging and cover all areas of learning.
- The childminder ensures her home is safe and welcoming. She has a wide range of varied and age-appropriate resources to motivate children.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children to behave well and respect others. She is aware of the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles. For example, through regular access to the outdoors, following good hygiene and providing healthy foods.
- The childminder understands the value of working with parents and other adults involved in children's lives, to promote consistency in children's learning and care.
- The childminder understands the importance of training and self-evaluation, in improving her knowledge and the overall quality of the provision for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector sampled some of the childminder's documentation, including her policies and procedures.
