Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder's relevant experience and qualification provide her with secure knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She demonstrates a clear understanding of children's learning and development.
- The childminder has a wide range of toys and play materials, to suit children of all ages and abilities. She plans activities, including outings, to promote children's interest and all areas of their development.
- The childminder has suitable systems in place to work in partnership with parents and others. This helps to promote continuity of care and meet children's individual needs.
- The childminder has clear observation, assessment and planning procedures, to monitor children's progress. She is aware of support services should children require additional help to progress.
- The childminder completes relevant training to maintain up-to-date knowledge. She has confident awareness of the procedures to safeguard children's welfare.
- The childminder describes positive methods to manage children's behaviour. She has clear policies and procedures relating to children's health, safety and well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about play activities for children.
- The inspector checked required documentation, including evidence of qualifications, suitability and training certificates.
- The inspector checked safety of the premises, toys and equipment.
- The inspector sampled policies and procedures.
