Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to reflect on the quality of her provision to identify areas for further development. She recognises the need to continue to improve her skills and knowledge.
- The childminder understands the procedures to report any concerns or allegations to the relevant authorities. She has a clear understanding of her role and responsibility to safeguard children.
- The childminder understands the importance of completing observations to assess and monitor children's progress. She describes how she will provide a suitable range of learning experiences to help children make good progress in their development.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour appropriately and become self-confident. She knows the importance of respecting others different to themselves.
- The childminder recognises the benefits of working closely with parents and other settings children attend, to promote continuity of children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
