Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of what to do in the event that she has a child protection concern and how to act promptly to safeguard children.
- The childminder knows how to support children's learning through play. She has a clear understanding of the importance of monitoring children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands child development, and is clear about the type of activities she provides to help children progress in all areas of development.
- The childminder values the importance of developing sound partnerships with parents and other involved in children's care. This helps to enable them to contribute and support children's learning, individual needs and inclusion.
- The childminder recognises how to support children's literacy, communication and language skills. For example, providing materials that promote languages and writing.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of strengthening her professional development and service provided, for example, through self-evaluation.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge and understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector observed that children's home and areas used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed the previous recommendation in relation to children's literacy skills, communication and language development.
