Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role in keeping children safe. She knows the signs to look out for, including what to do if she is concerned about a child in her care.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's behaviour, and help them to become emotionally and developmentally ready for their move to school.
- The childminder knows how to help children develop good hygiene practices, encourage healthy lifestyles and promote their physical well-being.
- The childminder understands how to assess children's development and plan for their individual needs, to extend their learning and support their progress.
- The childminder knows how to provide a range of activities to promote children's development across all areas of learning. She understands how to adapt activities to meet the needs of children who are within different stages of their learning.
- The childminder understands her roles and responsibilities in meeting the early years foundation stage requirements. She recognises the importance of reflecting and improving on her practice, and keeping her knowledge up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector completed a tour of the premises.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she evaluates and improves her service.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation, which the childminder intends to use, such as policies and procedures, attendance records and records for administering medicine.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the statutory requirements.

The childminder registered in 2007. She lives in Hainault, in the London Borough of Redbridge. The childminder operates Monday to Friday, from 7am to 6pm, for 48 weeks in the year. The childminder holds an appropriate qualification in childcare at level 3. There were no children in the early years age group on roll at the time of the inspection.
