Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of safeguarding procedures. She is able to recognise signs of potential abuse and knows how to escalate concerns about the welfare of a child.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements. She knows how to assess children's development and plan activities to help them make progress in their learning.
- The premises are clean and safe. The childminder understands how to support good hygiene routines and emphasise the health and well-being of children. The childminder knows how to create strategies to encourage children to build on their confidence and independently carry out acts of self-care.
- The childminder knows how to support children in managing their feelings and behaviour. She has considered how to create activities which develop children's social skills and understands how to create an inclusive environment.
- The childminder has carefully considered how she evaluates her provision to maintain continuous improvement. She completes further training to help improve her knowledge and skills. This benefits children in her care.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector sampled documentation the childminder has in place, including required insurance, training certificates, policies and procedures.
- The inspector completed a learning walk with the childminder and viewed the areas used for childminding. She also checked evidence of the suitability of adults living in the household.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her practice, including how she plans to continue to improve her service.
