Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has strengthened her safeguarding knowledge since her last inspection. She knows how to recognise signs of abuse and what to do if she becomes concerned about a child's welfare. The childminder understands the correct procedures she must follow if an allegation is made against her or a member of her household.
- The childminder explains how she assesses and minimises potential risks to children, in her home and when on outings. She has completed the required paediatric first-aid training, to help her respond appropriately if there is an accident or medical emergency.
- The childminder recognises the important role that parents play in their children's learning. She describes how she will exchange relevant information about children's progress and care routines, such as through discussions and emails to parents.
- The childminder describes how she will provide a broad curriculum, which supports all areas of children's learning. She details how she will offer interesting and engaging experiences to children, both in her home and on visits within the local community.
- The childminder explains how she will promote children's language and communication skills, such as by looking at books, singing songs and having conversations with children.
- The childminder outlines how she will promote healthy lifestyles for children. For example, she says that she will engage children's interest in healthy eating by growing food and cooking with them. She recognises the importance of physical exercise and outdoor play. She describes how she will provide daily outdoor activities in her garden and at local open spaces.
- The childminder explains how she will provide an inclusive environment where all children feel welcomed and valued. For example, she describes how she will support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities to access the curriculum and make the best possible progress.
- The childminder understands that it is important to review her practice and identify where she can enhance the experiences for children. She describes how she will use the views of parents and children to continuously develop her provision.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed any continued impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.

- The inspector had discussions with the childminder to check her understanding of the registration requirements.
- The childminder showed the inspector the areas of her home used for childminding. She discussed how she would ensure her home is safe and suitable for children.

The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
