Introduction

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under Sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of the registered early years provision. 'Early years provision' refers to provision regulated by Ofsted for children from birth to 31 August following their fifth birthday (the early years age group). The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and welfare, known as the *Early Years Foundation Stage*.

The provider must provide a copy of this report to all parents with children at the setting where reasonably practicable. The provider must provide a copy of the report to any other person who asks for one, but may charge a fee for this service (The Childcare (Inspection) Regulations 2008 regulations 9 and 10).

The setting also makes provision for children older than the early years age group which is registered on the voluntary and/or compulsory part(s) of the Childcare Register. This report does not include an evaluation of that provision, but a comment about compliance with the requirements of the Childcare Register is included in Annex B.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states if the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Description of the childminding

The childminder registered in 2007. She lives with her husband and four children aged 11, 9, two years and four months. They live in a flat in Peckham, which is within in the London Borough of Southwark. The whole of the childminder's flat is used for childminding. There is no secure garden for outside play but the childminder takes children out on a daily basis.

The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She is registered to care for a maximum of one child under eight years at any one time, who may be in the early years age group. There are currently no children on roll.

The overall effectiveness of the early years provision

The childminder's home is child-friendly and welcoming. She provides a good range of well-maintained toys and uses posters to make the environment a bright and cheerful place to play. The childminder uses risk assessment to manage the safety of her home and outings. She is aware of the need to regularly review this and record her findings. All relevant documentation required for the safe and efficient management of the provision is in place. The childminder has a very clear knowledge and understanding of her responsibilities towards child protection procedures approved by the Local Safeguarding Children Board.

The childminder has experience of working closely within the Early Years Foundation Stage. She demonstrates the ability to support and promote children's care and learning. Discussion shows that the childminder has carefully considered how she will meet children's individual needs and promote inclusion. This includes working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's care to promote continuity of care and support for their learning. She has suitable examples of systems for observation, assessment and planning to promote children's all-round development. Proposed activities include those to encourage children to explore other cultures and outings to learn about their local area and the wider world.

The childminder has a clear understanding of how to promote children's good health. She is aware of the need to gather information from parents regarding medical needs, dietary requirements and allergies. She updates her first aid training on a regular basis. The childminder also understands the importance of using self-evaluation to identify the strengths and weaknesses in her provision. She demonstrates a sound commitment to, and capacity for, continuous improvement.

Compliance with registration requirements

The registered person continues to meet the requirements of registration.
