Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she would plan to support children's learning. She describes how she would plan the curriculum to help children make progress in all areas of their development. She discusses that she will plan activities to support children's learning, based on their interests and what they need to learn.
- The childminder understands how to ensure her premises are safe and suitable for children. She describes changes she would make to her environment to minimise risks to children.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. She knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about children's welfare. The childminder understands the actions to take if there are any allegations made against her or members of her household.
- The childminder understands how to support children to develop an understanding of how to manage their self-care and become independent. She describes that she would support children to learn about how to gain an active and healthy lifestyle.
- The childminder explains that she will plan visits to the local playgroups and community, so children can take part in activities with other children to support their self-confidence and social skills and learn about the wider world.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing partnerships with parents and other professionals. She describes how she would share information with parents about the progress their children make.
- The childminder explains that she understands how to promote positive behaviour. She discusses that she would always remain calm and respectful and provide plenty of praise to ensure children gained a high level of self-esteem.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The childminder showed the inspector the premises. She discussed how she would ensure they are safe and suitable and changes she would make if children were attending.
- The inspector and childminder discussed her understanding of the learning and development and safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her childcare practices throughout the inspection to establish her understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation, including the childminder's public liability insurance and training certificates.
- The inspector verified evidence of suitability for the childminder and the adults working and living on the premises.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
