Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has developed her understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements. For example, she now maintains a valid paediatric first-aid qualification and understands how to provide quality experiences to help children make progress from their starting points. She understands the required documentation that must be in place regarding suitability of household members.
- The childminder understands her role in protecting children should any welfare concerns arise. She attends regular safeguarding training to help keep her knowledge up to date.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in close partnership with parents to help build on continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder recognises how to support children's physical well-being, and promote healthy lifestyles, such as through daily exercise and providing healthy meals.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice. She takes the views of children and parents into account to help secure improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage with the childminder to assess her knowledge and understanding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector sampled relevant documentation, including suitability checks, policies and procedures.
- The inspector checked all areas in the property used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she uses self-evaluation to develop her practice.
