## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The staff team has developed effective partnerships with parents and local schools to help promote the needs of any children who may attend.
- The manager demonstrates a clear understanding of how to plan age-appropriate activities for children to ensure they enjoy their time at the club.
- Staff understand the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles. Therefore, children have access to the inside and outdoor areas to practise their large motor skills and strengthen their physical development.
- The manager has clear procedures in place to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements and promote children's safety.
- The manager and staff team have a clear plan to develop the setting and improve experiences for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Green Olives Childcare registered in 2007. It is located in the London Borough of Southwark. The club operates from 7am to 9am and from 3pm to 6pm, Monday to Friday, during term time. There are currently four members of staff, including a volunteer. The manager holds a qualification in childcare at level 3 and two other members of staff hold relevant childcare qualifications. At time of the inspection, there were no children in the early years age range on roll.
