Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to support children's emotional well-being, confidence and self-esteem. She plans to help them understand the needs of others and to play cooperatively with each other. She plans to provide opportunities for older and younger children to learn from positive interactions with each other. She aims to provide an inclusive practice, in which children feel valued.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to identify and refer any concerns for children's welfare. She has up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding guidelines, including the 'Prevent' duty guidance.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership work and a shared approach to children's learning. She plans to share information with parents and professionals and works closely with them to support the needs of children who speak English as an additional language and those with special educational needs.
- The childminder reflects well on the strengths and weaknesses of her practice and provision. She has met the actions set in the previous visit from Ofsted. She maintains an appropriate paediatric first-aid qualification. The childminder understands her responsibility to inform Ofsted of significant changes.
- The childminder maintains her professional development, for example, through training. She demonstrates an understanding of how children learn and how to support their progress in different areas of their learning. She plans to provide regular opportunities for them to be physically active.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed areas of the premises that the childminder intends to use for children.
- The inspector assessed the effectiveness of the childminder's self-evaluation process.
- The inspector had discussions with the childminder and assessed how she maintains her knowledge of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documents including suitability checks and a paediatric first-aid certificate.
