Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. For example, she includes in her risk assessment how children will access and use the trampoline.
- The childminder understands how to protect children and how to report any safeguarding concerns she may have about children's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of teaching children and providing them with suitable activities that support their learning. She appreciates the value of working with parents and other providers to help children to achieve their goals.
- The childminder knows how to help children to develop positive attitudes towards others. She describes how she will encourage positive behaviour.
- The childminder understands how to support children's awareness of keeping healthy. For example, involving them in food preparation and encourage healthy exercise.
- The childminder explains how she reviews her practice and her understanding of developing her service further through reflection and accessing training, for example.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of the educational programmes.
- The inspector looked at a selection of documentation, including policies, procedures and information for parents.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's qualifications and the suitability of toys and resources for children.
- The inspector read the childminder's self-evaluation and discussed her plans for improvement.
