Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She does not know the possible signs that would raise concerns for a child's welfare, or the child protection procedures to follow.
- The childminder does not have a current relevant first-aid qualification. This is a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder does not assess or monitor children's progress in learning and development. She is not aware of the required progress check for two-year-old children.
- The childminder does not review the effectiveness of her practice to identify areas of weakness or target improvements. She does not understand how to meet children's learning needs and has not addressed recommendations from her previous inspection.
- The childminder is caring and understands how to promote children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The childminder undertakes risk assessments to help ensure the safety of her home.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
